SUBJECT: COVID-19 Seroprevalence Study - Presentation of Outcomes

ACTION REQUESTED

Receive a presentation on the outcomes of the Placer County COVID-19 seroprevalence study conducted by Stanford University.

BACKGROUND

On May 5, 2020, your Board directed the County Executive Officer to work with the Placer County Public Health Officer on a potential seroprevalence study. On May 26, 2020, your Board authorized the County Executive Officer to sign one or more agreements as necessary to conduct a COVID-19 seroprevalence study in Placer County.

On September 8, 2020, the County and the Board of Trustees of the Leland Stanford Junior University (Stanford) entered into a contract for services agreement whereby Stanford would conduct a study to estimate the seroprevalence of COVID-19 in Placer County.

On January 12, 2021, Dr. Julie Parsonnet, MD, George DeForest Barnett Professor of Medicine (Infectious Diseases) and Professor of Epidemiology and Population Health with Stanford University, provided your Board with an update on the study, including activities to date, preliminary data, and next steps.

Stanford has now completed the COVID-19 seroprevalence study. During today's workshop, Dr. Parsonnet will provide a presentation of the study's outcomes and be available to answer questions.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no net County cost associated with this item. The study is funded by the County's \$41.1 million federal CARES Act allotment.
