SUBJECT: Contract Amendment for City of Roseville Homeless Outreach Worker

ACTION REQUESTED

Approve an amendment to a revenue agreement with the City of Roseville for homeless outreach worker services for a revised term of November 21, 2019 through December 31, 2022 and to increase the contract by \$40,000 for an overall contract amount not to exceed \$120,000, and to authorize the Director of Health and Human Services to sign the amendment with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence and to sign any subsequent amendments up to \$12,000 consistent with the subject matter and scope of work with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.

BACKGROUND

Originally Placer County contracted with the City of Roseville in June 2018 for one year to provide an outreach worker to be integrated into Roseville's Social Services Unit (SSU), as well as receive referrals from the Roseville Housing Authority and other community partners in the area. The outreach worker connected with City of Roseville residents who were homeless or at-risk of homeless and referred individuals to support services, local nonprofits and housing resources. Following the success of this initial contract this current partnership was further developed.

Placer County agrees to provide the City of Roseville with two part-time Homeless Outreach Workers to partner, further identify and outreach with individuals who are homeless and in need of housing coordination and linkage to services. These two part time outreach positions are funded through a partnership with Placer County Health and Human Services, the City of Roseville, and the Downtown Roseville Partnership. The two part-time Homeless Outreach Workers are working with the Roseville Police Departments Social Services Unit and focus their efforts on engagement with local homeless or at risk of homelessness individuals. They work to link these individuals to shelter and housing services throughout the County. They also make assessments for other social services such as mental health and substance use treatment to increase their ability to retain and sustain housing within the community. This partnership is yet another example of the City, the County and other stakeholders working together to integrate services and improve the quality of life in our community.

This partnership also works in concert Placer County Probation Department and the Placer County HHS Homeless Liaisons working with the City. Through collaboration a coordination of services these teams have been able to support those they engage with comply with probation terms, successfully completing probation, following City laws and ordinances.

FISCAL IMPACT

The City of Roseville has received \$20,000 per year for two years from the Downtown Roseville Partnership and will be using \$20,000 per year for two years of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding for a total of \$40,000 towards the costs outlined above. Placer County is matching this funding with use of MHSA funding. No County General Funds are required. These dollars will be included in the Department's FY 2021-22 Budget.
