Non-Service Connected Pension

Pension is a needs-based program. The claimant must meet income and net worth requirements. Please see the inset panel for current income levels.

We will need the following documents to start a new claim for pension:

- Application from our office
- Care expense statement
- Physician's report
- Original military discharge (or certified copy)
- Marriage certificate (spouse/widow)
- Death



Disability Compensation

We can help the veteran file a new claim or reopen a previous claim for service connected disabilities with the VA. A service connected disability is an injury or illness that was incurred or aggravated beyond normal progression during active military service for which they were treated.

In order to assist with filing a new claim, we will need the following documentation:

- Original military discharge (or certified copy)
- Current medical diagnosis of disability

CalVet Fee Waiver

Dependents of veterans may be able to receive the California State Fee Waiver if they qualify under one of these plans:

Plan A (for spouse and/or children)

- The veteran must have war-time service. The veteran is 100% service connected disabled or death was service connected.
- Children between ages 14-27
- No age limit for spouse
- Spouse has not remarried after death of veteran
- Child is not receiving Ch. 35 VA benefits
- Death/disability occurred before the child's 21st birthday

Plan B (for children only)

- The adjusted gross income of the dependent is under the national poverty level for the previous tax year
- There is no age limit
- May be awarded with Ch. 35 VA benefits

Documentation needed:

- Application (DVS 40)
- Copy of Disability Award Letter or Notice of Death from the military
- Previous year's tax forms or non-filing status from the IRS or FTB
- Birth certificate for child
- Marriage certificate for spouse

Obtaining Service Records

We are able to assist the veteran and/or eligible next of kin in requesting military service records from the national archives. Please come into our office if this service is needed or visit archives.gov to make an online request.

Such records may include:

- Military Discharge (DD214)
- Medical treatment records
- Official military personnel file
- Request for military awards

DMV Veterans Designation

- Please bring in your discharge from active military service (DD 214) and a current California Driver License to obtain a Placer VSD 001.

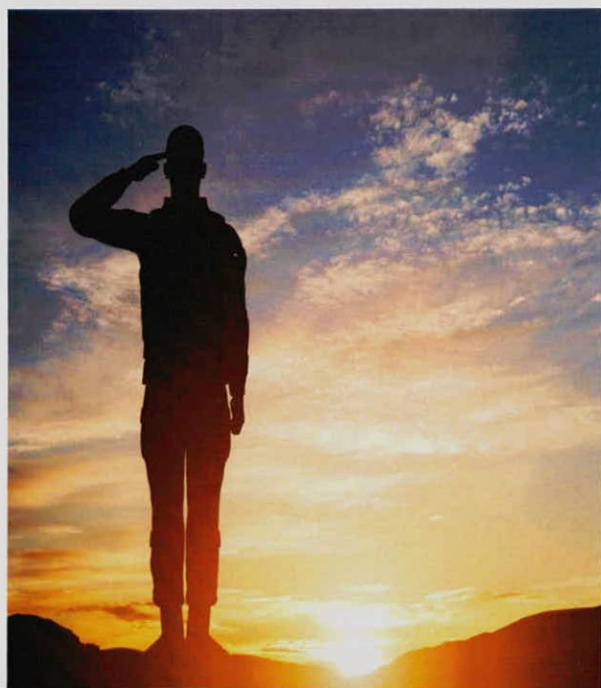
