SUBJECT: Temporary Traffic Signal Services – Road Tech Safety Services Inc.

ACTION REQUESTED

Approve the partial award of competitive Bid No. 20186 to Road-Tech Safety Services Inc. of Shingle Springs, CA for temporary traffic signal services in the total amount of \$247,320 for the period of June 22, 2021 through September 30, 2021.

Approve the partial cancellation of Bid No. 20186 for temporary pavement striping services in accordance with Section 6.1H of the Placer County Procurement Policy.

Authorize the Purchasing Manager to sign all required documents.

BACKGROUND

The Department of Public Works (DPW) requires a contractor to provide temporary intersection signalization at Grove Street and State Route 28 (North Lake Blvd.) in Tahoe City during the period of June 22, 2021 through September 30, 2021. This is one of several approaches which has been considered to address seasonal traffic congestion in the area.

The Procurement Services Division (Procurement) and DPW developed Invitation for Bids No. 20177 to solicit bids for temporary traffic signal services, including the provision of traffic signal equipment and pavement striping. No bids were received because none of the contractors who had indicated an interest in this project had the capability to provide all of the requested services. Procurement and DPW developed Bid No. 20186 to re-solicit bids for temporary traffic signals and temporary pavement striping services, allowing bids for one or both services. The bid was distributed via the County's e-Procurement system to five hundred twenty-two potential bidders and was posted on the County's website. Five vendors accessed the bid documents online. Bids were received from the following two firms:

Procurement recommends an award to Road-Tech Safety Services Inc., the lowest responsive and responsible bidder for temporary traffic signals. No bids were received for the pavement striping service. DPW will consider other options for this service. DPW has reviewed the evaluation and concurs with the award recommendation. No bid protests were received regarding the award recommendation.

Therefore, your Board's approval is required to proceed with award of a contract to Road-Tech Safety Services Inc. in the total amount of \$247,320 for the period of June 22, 2021 through September 30, 2021 and to cancel the pavement striping portion of Bid No. 20186.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funding for this service is from Transit Occupancy Tax funds and is included in the Department of Public Works' FY 2020-21 Final Budget and will be included in subsequent Submitted Budgets for the term of the contract.
