SUBJECT: Agreement for Short-Term Acute Inpatient Psychiatric Services

ACTION REQUESTED

Approve an agreement with Restpadd Inc. Redding, CA for the period of July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022 for psychiatric health facility services for a total amount not to exceed \$600,000 and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services to sign the contract with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence and any subsequent amendments up to \$60,000 consistent with subject matter and scope of work with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.

BACKGROUND

Placer County System of Care provides mandated mental health crisis intervention services to adults and children who are experiencing a mental health crisis. During FY 2019-20, over 3311 individuals received crisis evaluation services and approximately half of those required inpatient psychiatric hospitalization. If the County Psychiatric Health Facility (PHF) at Cirby Hills is at capacity, individuals are referred to alternate facilities such as other PHFs, Crisis Stabilization Units, or private inpatient psychiatric hospitals (as a last resort). We continue to see an increase in need for inpatient hospitalization and other contracted PHF's have often been at full capacity.

This agreement with the Redding Facility is critical given the shortage of psychiatric beds across the State. This is a first-time agreement with Restpadd Inc. for its Redding PHF location. The Redding PHF has been operational since 2012 serving 12 Counties in Northern California. They served 537 clients experiencing a mental health crisis in 2020 with an average length of stay of 7.4 days.

Your Board previously approved this item at its June 22, 2021 meeting, however staff returns with this item to correct the official name of the organization.

FISCAL IMPACT

For this agreement, consists of \$570,000 (95%) in State and Federal revenues and \$30,000 (5%) in County General funds and is included in the FY 2021-22 Budget.

The agreement is on file with Clerk of the Board.
