SUBJECT: BSCC Youth Programs and Facilities Grant Application

ACTION REQUESTED

Adopt an amended resolution ratifying the Chief Probation Officer's submission of a grant proposal and authorizing the Chief Probation Officer to sign the grant agreement with the California Board of State and Community Corrections for participation in the Youth Programs and Facilities Grant Program funded by the State of California in an amount up to \$250,000, for the grant period of June 10, 2021 through June 1, 2024, as well as subsequent amendments up to 10 percent, consistent with the application's subject matter and scope of work, with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.

BACKGROUND

On June 8, 2021, Chief Probation Officer Marshall Hopper brought forth a resolution adopted by your Board to allow capture of \$82,400 in State grant monies as outlined below. Subsequent to this action, BSCC has revised the grant awards twice because not all eligible counties submitted applications. As a result, Placer County's award was revised upward to \$152,571, a \$70,171 increase over the original award. Your action today allows the Probation Department to receive the revised award amount, even if the State subsequently increases the award again. The Probation Department will bring forward a budget amendment at the end of the first quarter of fiscal year 2022 to recognize the final amount.

On September 30, 2020, Governor Newsom signed Senate Bill 823 (Chapter 337, Statutes of 2020), which began the closure of the state's Division of Juvenile Justice (DJJ), realigning those state functions to county governments. Under SB 823 DJJ intake will close for most youth on July 1, 2021. Counties will then become fully responsible for housing, programming, and treatment of youth at higher offense and needs levels who will no longer be committed to DJJ.

As part of SB 823, \$9.6 million was set aside for the Board of State and Community Corrections to "award one-time grants, to counties for the purpose of providing resources for infrastructure-related needs and improvements to assist counties in the development of a local continuum of care." (Welf. & Inst. Code, § 2250, subd. (a).) Per the County Juvenile Population Index from the Department of Finance, Placer county qualifies for Medium Counties funding of \$82,400.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no new County cost associated with this agreement.

WHEREAS the Placer County Probation Department desires to participate in the Youth Programs and Facilities Grant Program funded through the California State General Fund and administered by the Board of State and Community Corrections (hereafter referred to as the BSCC).

WHEREAS counties such as Placer who are ranked by BSCC for juvenile population (age 12 – 17) as a medium sized county are eligible for funding as specified by the Board of State and Community Corrections in an amount up to \$250,000 to aid with SB823 implementation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED on behalf of the Placer County Board of Supervisors that the Chief Probation Officer's submission of the grant proposal for

this funding is hereby ratified and the Chief Probation Officer is authorized to sign the Grant Agreement with the BSCC, including any amendments thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Placer County Board of Supervisors agrees to ensure all matching funds required for the above grant are provided and abide by the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement as set forth by the BSCC.
