SUBJECT: Community Mental Health Services Block Grant Supplemental Funding

ACTION REQUESTED

Adopt a Resolution ratifying the submission to the California Department of Health Care Services application for:

1. The Crisis Care Mobile Units (CCMUs) infrastructure through funding from the Behavioral Health Continuum Infrastructure Program (BHCIP) in an amount not to exceed \$375,000 for the period September 15, 2021 through June 30, 2025 and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services, or designee, to sign and submit the application and all resulting documentation including reports, agreements and certifications as required to accept the funds with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence, and to sign any subsequent amendments, not to exceed \$37,500, consistent with the subject matter and scope of work with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.
2. The Crisis Care Mobile Units (CCMU) direct services through funding from the Coronavirus Response and Relief Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) to support and expand behavioral health mobile crisis and non-crisis services in an amount not to exceed \$125,000 for the period of September 15, 2021 through June 30, 2025, and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services, or designee, to sign and submit the application and all resulting documentation including reports, agreements and certifications as required to accept the funds with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence, and to sign any subsequent amendments, not to exceed \$12,500, consistent with the subject matter and scope of work with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.
3. The Crisis Care Mobile Units (CCMU) competitive grants for expansion of direct services and infrastructure in an amount not to exceed \$3,500,000 for the period of September 15, 2021 through June 30, 2025 and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services, or designee, to sign and submit the application and all resulting documentation including reports, agreements and certifications as required to accept the funds with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence, and to sign any subsequent amendments, not to exceed \$100,000, consistent with the subject matter and scope of work with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.

BACKGROUND

The California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) is utilizing \$150 million in funding received from the Behavioral Health Continuum Infrastructure Program (BHCIP) and \$55 million

received from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration through the Coronavirus Response and Relief Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) to support and expand behavioral health mobile crisis and on-crisis services. DHCS is requesting applications for two separate tracks of funding, for planning grants and for implementation grants. Placer County CSOC and ASOC intends to apply for the implementation grants for expansion of existing CCMU programs and to add programs for additional geographic locations in the county. Placer County must apply for to receive a guaranteed base allocation, and it is optional to apply for competitive grants above and beyond the base allocation. ASOC and CSOC intends to share the base allocation for services, including direct services and infrastructure as defined by the grant parameters, and to apply for a competitive grant for expansion capability.

FISCAL IMPACT

These Federal revenues and their associated expenditures will be included in the Department's FY 2021-22 Budget. No matching County General Funds are required.

WHEREAS, The Placer County Board of Supervisors approved Health and Human Services' application for renewal of the Federal Community Mental Health Block Grant for Fiscal Years 2021-2022 at the June 22, 2021 meeting.

WHEREAS, the State of California Department of Health Care Services, has received additional supplemental funding for the Federal Community Mental Health Block Grant through the Behavioral Health Continuum Infrastructure Program (BHCIP), American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), Crisis Care Mobile Units (CCMU) competitive grants for expansion of direct services, and the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental

Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) and has made these funds available to counties through grant application process.

WHEREAS the Children's System of Care is proposing to use the supplemental funds available through ARPA to expand family mobile crisis services to a larger geographic location within Placer County and to support the expansion of urgent care/crisis treatment locations.

WHEREAS, the Adult System of Care is proposing to use the supplemental funds available through the CRRSAA for enhancing and expanding early prevention services available to perinatal program services.

WHEREAS, both the Adult and Children's Systems of Care are proposing to utilize the supplemental funds available through both the ARPA and the CRRSAA fund for the facilities infrastructure modifications and to support the new urgent care services at the Cirby Hills location.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Placer, State of California, authorizes the Director of Health and Human Services, or designee, with express concurrence of County Counsel, and Risk Management, to approve and execute the a grant agreement for the Crisis Care Mobile Units (CCMUs) infrastructure through funding from the Behavioral Health Continuum Infrastructure Program (BHCIP) in an amount not to exceed \$375,000 for the period September 15, 2021 through June 30, 2025 and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services, or designee, to sign any subsequent amendments, not to exceed \$37,500, consistent with the subject matter and scope of work with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Health and Human Services, or designee, with express concurrence of County Counsel, and Risk Management approve and execute the grant agreement for the Crisis Care Mobile Units (CCMU) competitive grants for expansion of direct services and infrastructure in an amount not to exceed \$3,500,000 for the period of September 15, 2021 through June 30, 2025 and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services, or designee, to sign any subsequent amendments, not to exceed \$100,000, consistent with the subject matter and scope of work with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.
