KNOW BEFORE YOU GO	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Disturbing your property can jeopardize your insurance process. This outline will help you with the steps for proper debris clean up and your options.
INSURANCE COMPANY	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Obtain from your insurance company, the "debris removal" coverage portion of your insurance, if any. Please review the CalOES Frequently Asked Questions document for further information.
COMPLETE RIGHT OF ENTRY (ROE) FORM	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•See the River Fire Recovery Page for the Right of Entry (ROE) form and information on understanding the ROE. Return form to Environmental Health (EH).•Please verify all required information is submitted with the ROE form including number of vehicles destroyed.•Identify any materials that are hazardous (propane tanks, heating oil tanks, vehicle fuels like diesel or gasoline tanks, car batteries, paint, etc.).•If your home was mobile or manufactured identify on the form.•Carefully complete the attached Property Information Form and append any maps, diagrams, or legible notes that may be useful to the State's contractor in locating subgrade structures, including the location of septic tanks, leach fields, water wells, fuel tanks, or other subgrade structures. PRIVATE PARTY CLEAN UP/ALTERNATIVE PROGRAM	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•If owner(s) decide NOT to participate in the Debris and Hazard Tree Removal program, then complete the "Alternative Program" form provided by EH.•Owner agrees to follow all State Cal OES requirements for private contractor clean up as described in the Placer County Ash and Debris guidance.
DEBRIS REMOVAL PROCESS	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Phase 1 Removal: This is the "household hazardous waste" removal portion performed by the State. No application is required for this phase of removal. Phase 1 removal was completed the week of September 13, 2021.•Phase 2 Removal: This requires the ROE form completed and approved before it can begin. Once the ROE is approved, the State will send contractors to our County to start the debris and hazardous tree removal process. Soil sampling is done by the contractor. Once the soil tests come back clean (no contamination) and erosion control is completed, the contractor for the State will complete the Final Sign Off Form. EH will then coordinate with the Building Department on approval of pending building permits and temporary power permits.
WHAT CAN YOU DO DURING THE DEBRIS CLEAN-UP PROCESS?	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•While waiting for Phase 2 Removal to be completed, owners can start to plan for the rebuilding process.•Building Permit - Submit completed construction drawings for your new home along with permit application to the Building Department.•Septic System - See EH informational handout. Septic authorization permit from EH is required. No septic repair permits required for replacement of like items. Contact EH with any questions.•Water/Sewer Service Connections (PCWA or NID)•Utility Repair to Wells (County) - No EH well permits are required to repair the well casing. Contact well drilling company to repair the well. Acceptable well bacteriology report is required prior to occupancy final.
