**SUBJECT:** Resolution to Provide SB 1383 Services

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**ACTION REQUESTED**

Adopt a Resolution authorizing the Director of Health and Human Services to enter into evergreen agreements with local governments to provide SB 1383 inspection and education services and recover related costs with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.

**BACKGROUND**

In September 2016, California Legislature passed Senate Bill 1383. This bill requires reduction of organic food waste, including edible food from disposal in landfills. In November of 2020, CalRecycle adopted implementing regulations which require jurisdictions to, among other things establish food recovery programs.

SB 1383 requires local jurisdictions to provide education and ensure compliance of Commercial Edible Food Generators on an ongoing basis. Commercial Edible Food Generators include large restaurants, large event venues and grocery stores. Commercial Edible Food Generators are required to retain edible food that otherwise would be discarded and instead donate it to food recovery organizations to distribute via charitable feeding organizations. Environmental Health Division (EHD) currently provides these services on behalf of the county in unincorporated areas.

Cities in the county are also required to administer local food recovery programs. EHD already conducts food safety inspections throughout the county including in incorporated cities and towns, and provides education and compliance services for Commercial Edible Food Generators in unincorporated areas, local governments may find EHD services an effective and streamlined approach for education of Edible Food Generators in their jurisdiction.

Health and Human Services (HHS) is requesting permission to enter into agreements with local governments to provide these services to further streamline overall compliance with SB 1383 on a fee basis to ensure no net county cost.

**FISCAL IMPACT**

Fee for service will result in no net county cost.
