**ACTION REQUESTED**

1. Adopt a Resolution ratifying the Director of Health and Human Services' grant application for \$6,169,970 from the State Department of Healthcare Services Behavioral Health California Infrastructure Program (BHCIP) for a site at the Placer County Government Center and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services, or designee, to sign the resulting agreement and all related paperwork with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.
2. Adopt a Resolution ratifying the Director of Health and Human Services' grant application for \$349,045 from the State Behavioral Health California Infrastructure Program (BHCIP) for a site at the Home Key Round Two proposed location and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services, or designee, to sign the resulting agreement and all related paperwork with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.

**BACKGROUND**

The State Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) was authorized through 2021 legislation to establish the Behavioral Health Continuum Infrastructure Program (BHCIP), and awarded approximately \$2.1 billion to be used by December 2026, to "construct, acquire, and expand properties and invest in mobile crisis infrastructure related to behavioral health." There are six rounds of funding as a result of this legislation that have been and will be presented to County and other organizations as opportunities to expand existing resources. Round 3 funding will be awarded to those applicants who have projects that are "Launch Ready," to begin immediate work towards acquiring or re-purposing land/space for behavioral health services/programs.

Placer County has initiated two separate applications for these "Launch Ready" Round 3 grant funds which have been sent to the Department for review and consideration. These two applications represent the two separate actions requested of your Board for approval.

The first action is requesting approval for a proposal to repurpose a County-owned property on the Placer County Government Center campus at 11583 C Avenue Building 117 in Auburn, home of the previously operated Health and Human Services Medical clinic. Health and Human Services has proposed to repurpose this vacated building to construct a 24/7 Behavioral Health

Respite Center for 10-16 adults and children that is open to the public and residents in need of short-term behavioral crisis services. This project is an innovative approach that will help serve as an alternative to restrictive and costly Psychiatric Health Facility (PHF) admissions and better provide our community with another option for someone in crisis.

The second action is approving a similar proposal at 110 North Sunrise Ave in Roseville, home of the Hampton Inn, which is the proposed site for Project Home Key. If Project Home Key is approved, the first floor of the hotel would be renovated to accommodate 12-16 adults, also in a 24/7 Behavioral Health Respite Center that is open to adult residents and the public. This project will likewise provide an alternative option to restrictive and costly PHF options.

**FISCAL IMPACT**

If awarded this grant, Health and Human Services could receive up to \$6,519,015 in revenue. If applicable, the 10% match funding requirement will be met with the value of the property or funds that are available in the Department's FY 2021-22 Budget.
