SUBJECT: Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant Funding Allocation and Application

ACTION REQUESTED

Adopt a Resolution authorizing the Director of Health and Human Services, or Designee, to execute the Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant (SABG) Funding Allocation and Application with the California Department of Health Care Services for the period of July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2024, in an amount not to exceed \$3,196,998 with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence, and to sign the resulting agreement and any resulting documentation including any subsequent amendments up to \$100,000 consistent with the subject matter and scope of work with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.

BACKGROUND

The Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) utilizes the revenue agreement to outline requirements and federal funding for mandated Substance Use Services; specifically, Federal Substance Abuse, Prevention and Treatment Community Block Grant funding (SAPT).

Placer County has established a continuum of care with this funding (along with Drug Medi-Cal and the realigned funding) to best meet the substance use treatment and prevention needs of its residents. Some services are offered by County Staff (screening, assessment, and case management), but most treatment services are offered by contracted community providers. Screening clinics offer information, resources, referral, and linkage to substance use treatment. These free clinics are offered Tuesday through Thursday in varied locations, as well as by telephone and synchronous video.

Additionally, this funding allows Placer County to support collaborative Courts and other criminal justice programs that benefit from linkage to treatment. Other services that are paid for, or subsidized with these funds, include prevention efforts, specialized services for woman with children, assessments, case management, outpatient, detox, residential, transitional housing, and aftercare treatment services. In order to ease access to care, not all levels of service require coming to the screening clinics.

This application is not able to be included on file as it is still being finalized with data in order to

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meet the May 11th application deadline. If this action is approved, the application will be reviewed by County Counsel prior to submittal.

FISCAL IMPACT

This action is 100% revenue and will be included in the Department's FY 2022-23 and FY 2023-2024 Budgets.
