SUBJECT: KidsFirst Child Abuse Prevention Council of Placer County Agreement

ACTION REQUESTED

Approve a contract with KidsFirst Child Abuse Prevention Council of Placer County to provide child abuse prevention activities and operation of the Child Abuse Prevention Council from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023 for a total amount not to exceed \$308,073 and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services to sign the contract with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence and to sign subsequent amendments not to exceed \$30,807 consistent with the subject matter and scope of work with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.

BACKGROUND

California counties are required to convene and support a local Child Abuse Prevention Council. For over 30 years, KidsFirst Child Abuse Prevention Council of Placer County (KidsFirst) has effectively delivered this community based outreach and education to parents, caregivers and other professionals. These services include:

- Operation of Family Resource Centers in Auburn and Roseville, including the delivery of counseling, parent education and assistance in accessing other services for caregivers which foster independence.
- Data gathering, analysis and reporting for the entire county network of Family Resource Centers.
- Providing public service information to help daycare, preschool and other early childhood providers in support of families, to have the most accessible and available resources in their own communities.
- Providing assistance to families and parents to advocate effectively for their children in obtaining health, education, medical, dental, mental health and other services.

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) includes additional federal Community-Based Child Abuse Prevention (CBCAP) funds for counties to use for child abuse prevention direct services and planning activities. Use of these funds in the agreement with KidsFirst will allow for increased education, public information, and outreach regarding child abuse prevention services in our community.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funding for this contract includes \$36,969 (12%) in Federal funding, \$261,862 (85%) in State funding and \$9,243 (3%) reimbursed by the Children's Trust Fund and is included in the Department's FY 2022-23 Budget. No additional County General Funds are required.
