SUBJECT: Agreement with Advocates for Mentally Ill Housing, Inc. for Adult Residential Facility

ACTION REQUESTED

Approve an agreement with Advocates for Mentally Ill Housing Inc. (AMI Housing) a nonprofit corporation, for Adult Residential Facility (ARF) services in an amount not to exceed \$267,380 for the period of July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023 and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services to execute the agreement with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence, and to sign subsequent amendments not to exceed \$26,738 consistent with the subject matter and scope of work with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.

BACKGROUND

Placer County provides mental health services to over 7,100 adults County-wide each year. Many of these adults require housing with supportive services to assist them in meeting their complex and unique needs. This type of housing is often necessary for many who are too disabled and who cannot live independently but are successful in a structured setting. Through this agreement, Placer County Adult System of Care is able to provide these housing and other basic services to residents to reduce the need for a more restrictive placement such as Institute for Mental Disease (IMD) or Psychiatric Health Facility (PHF).

AMI Housing is focused on housing and providing supportive services to the most vulnerable residents of our county. This organization develops and operates a full spectrum of housing programs from emergency housing to rapid rehousing to permanent housing in Placer and Nevada Counties. AMI Housing currently provides housing, housing coordination, supportive services, life skills training, and employment services for individuals who may be homeless with little or no income and are: transitional age youth, older adults, previously incarcerated, homeless adults, homeless families, and single parents with children. By partnering with many different community-based organizations and government agencies, AMI Housing is creating vital community solutions and supports. Additional funds are being added to increase capacity to serve this population.

FISCAL IMPACT

The funding for this agreement includes \$200,535 (75%) in Federal funding, \$10,695 in State funding (4%), and \$56,150 (21%) in County General Funds and is included in the Department's FY 2022-23 Budget.
