SUBJECT: Revenue Sharing – Placer Food Bank

ACTION REQUESTED

Approve appropriation of \$1,750 in Revenue Sharing monies to Placer Food Bank as requested by Supervisor Gore (\$1,000), Supervisor Weygandt (\$250), and Supervisor Jones (\$500).

BACKGROUND

In approving the following contributions, the Placer County Board of Supervisors finds that each and every approved contribution serves a public purpose by promoting the general welfare of the County and its inhabitants, therefore a benefit results to the County.

Placer Food Bank serves as the foremost hunger-relief charity for Placer, El Dorado, and Nevada Counties and is the region's only Feeding America-certified food bank. The organization distributes fresh and non-perishable food to the hungry through its network of local charitable agency partners, serving people of all ages throughout local communities. The Placer Food Bank integrates food safety and nutrition education into all of their programs to promote healthy eating. With record high inflation, as well as a rise in food and fuel prices, there is a surging demand for food assistance for those living in poverty or in vulnerable communities. Revenue Share contributions will be used to help offset the cost of food and supplies provided monthly to high-need, low food access areas and households.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funding is provided for in the FY 2021-22 Community and Agency Support budget (CC10018). There is no additional impact to the general fund.

Describe the organization's purpose and/or mission and the people served.

Placer Food Bank's (PFB) mission is to sustain communities by nourishing individuals and families experiencing food insecurity, educating the community about hunger, while advocating for hunger relief. PFB was established in 1970 as the Community Resources Council to help the poor. For over 52 years, the organization has grown to become a leading hunger relief distribution hub and Feeding America affiliate serving a regional network (e.g. rural food banks, food closets and pantries, shelters, congregate meal programs, churches, schools) that feed the hungry in over 4,000 square miles of territory in Placer, El Dorado and Nevada counties. The PFB mission is advanced through five major programs: emergency food aid; Kids Backpacks and School Pantries; PantryToGo; and CalFresh Outreach and Application Assistance. We integrate food safety and nutrition education into all of our programs to promote healthy eating.

Briefly describe the program or the event for which you are requesting funds.

Although the pandemic is losing intensity, for those living in or near poverty, things are getting worse. Record high inflation is causing a rise in housing, fuel and food costs for everyone. PFB is experiencing a surging demand for food assistance especially in vulnerable communities. For example, Placer County's poverty rate is seemingly low (7.7%) compared to state (16.4%) and national (14.4%) figures. However, communities of color here are disproportionately affected, where 13% live in poverty. Pockets of poverty in Roseville, Auburn, Lincoln and remote/rural areas of Foresthill and Sheridan have a long history of high poverty, unemployment, food insecurity and poor health outcomes. The rise in food prices disproportionately affects them because they spend a larger share of income on food. With heightened demand comes increased costs to PFB for fuel, purchasing food items (example: produce costs are up 57% and milk rose over 40% last year). Amid bottlenecked supply chains, robust consumer demand, and disruptions to global food and energy markets, PFB does not expect a reprieve from inflation anytime soon.

Briefly describe how Revenue Sharing funding would be utilized. (Please list items and activities to be funded with any Revenue Sharing funds allotted. Funding cannot be used for core budget needs or program or event staffing such as security, instructors, cleanup crews, etc.)

The funding support from from the Revenue Sharing Fund will help PFB purchase produce, dairy, and healthy food staples through its membership with California Association of Food Banks or other wholesale sources at low cost. Food will be distributed at our PantryToGo locations in Placer County - Colfax, Lincoln, Rocklin, Roseville, and Sheridan. These monthly distributions, provide perishable and non-perishable food free of charge to households in high-need, low-food access areas.
