SUBJECT: California Department of Social Services Community Care Expansion
Preservation Program

ACTION REQUESTED

Ratify approval of submission of the application with the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) for the Community Care Expansion (CCE) Preservation Program for a period through June 30, 2029 in an amount not to exceed \$734,669, with a County match up to \$73,466, and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services to determine the start date and execute the resulting agreement, to accept additional related funds not to exceed \$100,000, with a County match up to \$10,000, and to sign related amendments and documentation related to this funding, consistent with the subject matter and scope of work, with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.

BACKGROUND

The California Department of Social Services (CDSS) Community Care Expansion (CCE) Preservation Program was established through Assembly Bill 172 (Chapter 696, Statutes or 2021). The CCE Preservation Program will make noncompetitive allocations to counties for the preservation of licensed residential and senior care facilities serving applicants and recipients of Supplemental Security Income/State Supplementary Payment (SSI/SSP) or Cash Assistance Program for Immigrants (CAPI), including those who are experiencing, or at risk of homelessness. Two types of funding are available: Operating Subsidy Payments (OSP) to cover potential or projected operating deficits in existing residential adult or senior care facilities so they can avoid closing and Capital Project (CP) funding to allow facilities to make essential physical repairs or necessary upgrades to avoid closure or make the facility compliant with licensing standards.

Placer County, Health and Human Services Division, Adult System of Care (ASOC) will design and implement the program for Placer County. ASOC will be responsible for disbursing funds to local, existing licensed adult and senior care facilities serving qualified individuals.

Placer County will receive \$200,000 in Operating Subsidy Payments with no match or in-kind requirement. Placer will receive \$534,669 in Capital Project funding which requires a 10% match. With these funds Placer County will be able to assist local, licensed adult residential facilities that are at risk of closure or losing their licensure. Facilities at the highest risk of closure that can be prevented by either or both funds, and facilities with the highest percentage of

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number of qualified residents will be prioritized. A qualified resident is an individual who is experiencing homelessness, or at risk of experiencing of homelessness.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact as a result of submitting the application. However, if the application results in an agreement, the funds will be included in the Department's FY 2022-23 budget with a quarterly budget amendment, and will be included in the Department's future budgets. There is no additional impact to the General Fund.
