**SUBJECT:** Board of State and Community Corrections Proposition 47 Grant Award

**ACTION REQUESTED**

1. Adopt a Resolution ratifying the submission of the application to the Board of State and Community Corrections for the Proposition 47 grant award in the amount of \$6,000,000 for the period of September 1, 2022 through June 1, 2026, and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services to accept the funds and sign the resulting agreement with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence, and to sign all resulting documentation, reports, certifications, and amendments up to \$100,000, consistent with the agreement's subject matter and scope of work with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.
2. Approve a FY 2022-23 budget amendment #AM-00696 for CC14001- Adult System of Care in the amount of \$916,093.

**BACKGROUND**

In November of 2014 California voters approved Proposition 47, the Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act. Prop. 47 is to ensure that prison spending is focused on violent and serious offenses, to maximize alternatives for non-serious, nonviolent crime, and to invest the savings generated from this act into prevention and support programs in K–12 schools, victim services, and mental health and drug treatment.

The Board of State and Community Corrections was assigned to administer a grant program aimed at supporting mental health and substance use disorder treatment, and diversion programs for people in the criminal justice system. The emphasis is on programs that reduce recidivism of people convicted of less serious crimes, such as those covered by this measure and those who have substance abuse and mental health problems. (Gov. Code, §7599.2, subd. (a)(3).)

In August of 2017, Placer County received the initial Proposition 47 grant which was used to create and implement the Proposition 47 Action Team (AT). Since January 2018, the Proposition 47 Action Team has provided wraparound services to address mental health, substance use, and diversion needs of adults in Placer County.

In March of 2019, Placer County HHS in collaboration with Placer County Probation submitted a

proposal to expand the Placer County Action Team. Placer County's proposal was one of only 23 counties in the state to be selected for Cohort 2 funds; which provided \$6,000,000 for continued services. Through both Proposition 47 Cohorts, the Action team has been able serve 288 clients in 3 different locations.

In April 2022, Placer County HHS in collaboration with Placer County Probation and the Placer County District Attorney's Office again submitted an application for Proposition 47 funds. Placer County's proposal was approved and \$6,000,000 has been awarded to continue Action Team services. New to our Proposition 47 program will be a Pre-File Program (PFP) to reduce court costs and offer alternative options for qualified participants. The Pre-File Program will target individuals with recent arrests and citations before charges are filed and give them an opportunity to participate in educational training through our local PREP centers. All participants will be screened and referred for mental health and/or substance use treatment should those services needed. For persons who complete these requirements, they will leave the program with a clean criminal record.

The Placer County Proposition 47 Action Team will continue deliver culturally competent, strength-based, individual and family-driven, wraparound services to address mental health, substance use, and diversion needs of individuals of all ages. This program will deliver mental health and/or substance use treatment as well as provide support in finding safe and stable housing, develop vocational or educational skills, and create positive social communities to support healthy choices. Services are tailored to the individual's needs, are culturally competent and trauma-informed, and will divert individuals from the legal system and prevent recidivism. The goal of Proposition 47 services to promote safe and healthy communities.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

The \$6,000,000 in revenue from the grant will be included in CC14001 - Adult System of Care, with \$916,093 being included in the Department's FY 2022-23 Budget via budget amendment #AM 00696. The remaining amount will be included in the Department's Future Budgets. There is no impact to the General Fund.
