WHEREAS, the County of Placer has established regulations governing public access to Public Recreation Areas (PRAs), which are contained in the Placer County Code Chapter 12, Article 12.24, and pertain to PRAs owned and/or managed by Placer County and other public agencies; and,

WHEREAS, Article 12.24 requires the Board of Supervisors, by Resolution, to designate County parks, trails, and open space areas as PRAs that will be subject to the Placer County Public Recreation Areas Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, on November 19, 2021, the United States Secretary of the Interior issued Secretarial Order SO-3404 declaring "Squaw" a derogatory term and implementing procedures to remove the term from Federal usage, and the federal renaming process concluded on September 8, 2022, which renamed Squaw Valley to Olympic Valley; and

WHEREAS, your Board approved a Resolution on December 14, 2021, to rename the Olympic Valley Municipal Advisory Council and approved another Resolution on February 22, 2022, to rename three public roads in the Olympic Valley Area which contained the word "Squaw." Those roads were renamed Olympic Valley Road, Shirley Canyon Road, and Marmot Way; and

PARKS, TRAILS, AND OPEN SPACES SUBJECT TO REGULATION UNDER ARTICLE 12.24

WHEREAS, two PRAs currently contain the term "Squaw," and those PRAs are Squaw Valley Trail and Squaw Valley Park, both located on Olympic Valley Road in Olympic Valley, California.

WHEREAS the Washoe Tribe has requested the removal of the term "Squaw" from County properties and organizations; and

WHEREAS, a community survey conducted in 2021 showed that out of 690 responses, a vast majority (64%) supported renaming Squaw Valley Park to "Olympic Valley Park."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Placer, State of California, that two existing PRAs, Squaw Valley Park and Squaw Valley Trail, are renamed as Olympic Valley Park and Olympic Valley Trail, respectively, as reflected in the list of PRAs subject to Article 12.24 of the Placer County Code, attached as Exhibit 1.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take full force and effect immediately.
