


Existing view to the southwest from Squaw Valley Road of the project site in spring

Viewpoint 6: Views near the Resort at Squaw Creek in Spring (Exhibit 8-14, Existing View)

This viewpoint is representative of the panoramic views of the western end of Squaw Valley under conditions with little or no snow (late spring, summer, early fall) as viewed from the area east of the project site. Foreground views are of the golf course and meadow. The existing Intrawest Village structures and Squaw Valley Meadows condominiums are visible in the middleground. The ski resort support facilities (snow making building, maintenance buildings) are visible to the south of the resort buildings. The rocky slopes of the mountains enclosing the west end of the Valley are in the middleground behind the existing resort. Lift towers are visible on the mountain.

Viewpoint 7: View of Squaw Valley from Ski Slope – Night (Exhibit 8-15, Existing View)

This viewpoint provides a representative view of nighttime lighting conditions under existing conditions. The view is from the ski slopes on the south side of the Valley. Lighting is visible from the resort in the foreground, and lights from residences on the north slopes of the Valley are visible in the middleground.

Viewpoint 8: View of Project Site from Squaw Valley Road in Winter (Exhibit 8-16, Existing View)

This view is representative of how viewing conditions may be altered during overcast winter weather. The view is from Squaw Valley Road near Far East Road to the southwest. Foreground views are of the Far East Center, and utility poles and lines. A garage and hotel are in the middleground, partially obscured by vegetation in this view. Low clouds and mist obscure more distant views of the ski slopes and mountain tops.

Viewpoint 9: View of Project Site from Intrawest Village in Winter (Exhibit 8-17, Existing View)

This viewpoint is representative of views from guest rooms facing south in the Intrawest Village lodgings, located to the west of the project site. Views in the near foreground to the south include the parking lot; and parking structures, Red Dog Lodge, another hotel, and maintenance buildings are in the more distant foreground. The lower slopes of the ski runs and ski lifts on the south side of the Valley are also visible.

Viewpoint 10: View of Project Site from Intrawest Village in Winter (Exhibit 8-18, Existing View)

This viewpoint is representative of views from guest rooms facing east in the Intrawest Village lodgings. Views to the east include parking lots, the Red Wolf Lodge, Red Dog Maintenance structure, and a portion of the Squaw Kids building. The Far East Center is in the near foreground and lower slopes of the ski runs are visible on the south side of the Valley in the more distant foreground. Forested slopes on the north side of the Valley and residential buildings are partially visible in the foreground as well. The Resort at Squaw Creek is visible in the middleground, partially obscured by trees at the edge of the meadow and golf course. Background views with forested ridges are visible beyond the east end of the Valley.

Viewpoint 11: View from Olympic Village Inn in Winter (Exhibit 8-19, Existing View)

This viewpoint is representative of views from guest rooms facing south in the Olympic Village Inn, on the north side of the main Village area. Near foreground views are of aspens, conifers, and the rooftop and deck of the Olympic Valley Lodge (formerly the 1960 Olympics Athletes' Center). Foreground views also include the upper slopes of the mountains on the south side of the Valley with cleared ski runs.

Viewpoint 12: East Parcel at East End of Squaw Valley (Exhibit 8-20, Existing View)

This viewpoint is representative of views from Squaw Valley Road and from businesses on the south side of Squaw Valley Road looking towards the East Parcel. Foreground views are of a split rail fence and small conifers along the roadway. Road signs and utility lines and poles are also visible along the roadway. The vacant parcel has been cleared of vegetation (see Exhibit 8-6, Photograph 13). Forested slopes and granite peaks are visible in the middleground and background.
