

A Coloring Tour of Auburn Landmarks

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Auburn Promenade

853 Lincoln Way. There has been a hotel on this site since 1879. It has had many names. The Putnam, The Conroy, the Hotel Placer, and the Hotel Auburn. The hotel burned down and was rebuilt several times.



Claude Chana Statue

Chana was the first person to find gold in our town in 1848.



Pioneer Methodist Church

1348 Lincoln Way. This is the oldest church in our town. In 1858, the ladies from the church walked from business to business collecting money to build it. They got a lot of money from miners at the local saloons.




Bank

874 Lincoln Way. This Bank was once called the Bank of California and before that the Placer County Bank. This building was built in 1913.



Placer County Courthouse

It took four years to build this ornate building, from 1894 to 1898. It is the seat of justice for all of the county and Auburn's best-known landmark.



Old Town Post Office

This building was built in 1855 and became the Post Office in 1878.




Bernhard Winery

277 Sacramento Steet. This building was built by Bernhard Bernhard in 1874 to store his wine. In 1868 when he bought this farm, it had an orchard, vineyard and a farmhouse. The farmhouse was the Traveler's Rest hotel that was built in 1851.



Old Town Firehouse

This firehouse was built in 1891. When the freeway was built they had to move this firehouse. It was a block west of here.




Railroad Trestle

This crossing was built so trains would have one track going west and one track going east. The trains on this track go east. This Auburn landmark welcomes travelers to our town.



Auburn Civic Center and City Hall

This building was built as an elementary school in 1915. The architect who designed it was very famous. His name was William H. Weeks.



Joss House

200 Sacramento Street. This building was built in 1921 and served as a temple and meeting place for the Chinese community in our town. It was part of Auburn's Chinatown.



Tahoe Club

900 Lincoln Way. The Tahoe Club started as a men's social club. They built this building in 1913 and meet on the upper floor.
