BACKGROUND/COMMUNITY BENEFITS: In approving the following contributions, the Placer County Board of Supervisors finds that each and every approved contribution serves a public purpose by promoting the general welfare of the County and its inhabitants therefore a benefit results to the County.

The Board of Supervisors is being asked to support the Crime Victims United Charitable Foundation's 16th annual Classic Cup Golf Tournament being held at the Granite Bay Country Club.
