Action Requested:

Your Board is requested to accept a vehicle donation in the estimated amount of \$50,000 from Search and Rescue non-profit organization (SAR) to be used in Placer County search and rescue operations and to add the vehicle to the Master Fixed Asset List.

Background:

The Placer County Search and Rescue non-profit organization raises funds to purchase equipment to Placer County for use in its Search and Rescue operations. The SAR was approached in May by Off-Road Adventures Magazine and Daimler Chrysler with the possibility of donating a new 2006 Jeep Commander to its operations. The new vehicle would be equipped with additional features and add-ons donated by various manufacturers. The magazine would run a four-part article featuring the jeep as it was being built-up. In return for their donations, the manufacturers would be receiving recognition in the magazine with the intent the vehicle would be given to a non-profit organization for the rescue/recovery of lost persons or other related public service. The editor of the magazine was considering several search and rescue operations throughout California to donate this vehicle. After speaking at length to our lieutenant who oversees SAR, Off-Road Adventures Magazine notified SAR that it had been selected to receive this donated vehicle.

The fully built-up 2006 Jeep Commander has been received and registered to SAR. SAR wishes to donate the vehicle to Placer County Sheriff's Department for use in search and rescue operations. Its base value is approximately \$44,000 with another \$6,000 in additional equipment.
