SUBJECT: Assemblyman Ted Gaines: Farewell Remarks and Appreciation to former colleagues on the Board of Supervisors.

ACTION REQUESTED

Assemblyman Ted Gaines would like to extend a farewell and appreciation to his former colleagues and Placer County for the successes achieved during his tenure as Placer County Supervisor representing District 4.

BACKGROUND

On November 7, 2006, Supervisor Ted Gaines was elected to the California State Assembly. He attended his last Placer County Board of Supervisors' meeting, as a Board member, on November 20, 2006 and took office as an Assemblyman on December 4, 2006.

Ted Gaines began his service in government on the City of Roseville's Planning Commission from 1997 to 1999. Ted Gaines was elected in November 2000 and took office as Placer County Board of Supervisor, District 4 in January 2001. He was reelected to his 2nd, 4-year term in March 2004. Committees that Ted served on include: Placer County Air Pollution Control, Golden Sierra Job Training Partnership, Chair of Placer County Transportation Authority (PCTPA), Chair of Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG), SACOG Housing and Land Use Committee and Sacramento Area Commerce and Trade Organization (SACTO). He also belongs to the Roseville Rotary Club, is a graduate of the Roseville Chamber Leadership Program and is a member of Bayside Covenant Church. His primary areas of policy interest include public safety, transportation, parks, land use and government efficiency.

Ted Gaines' family has been a part of Placer County since his great, great grandfather James Kaseberg owned a sheep ranch next to the Placer County Fair Grounds in Roseville.
