BACKGROUND

HomeAid Sacramento was founded in 1996 as the philanthropic arm of the North State Building Industry Association which seeks to make a difference in the lives of those needing temporary shelter for homeless families or individuals. Since 1996 HomeAid Sacramento has completed 11 projects in the Sacramento region and in the coming year expects to complete an additional five projects which will provide an additional 150 shelter beds to the Sacramento region. Two of the five projects have begun construction including a safe house for PEACE for Families in Auburn. As members of the North State Building Industry Association, HomeAid's greatest success is the ability to give back to the community in a positive, meaningful and lasting way.

WHEREAS, HomeAid Sacramento was founded in 1996 as the philanthropic arm of the North
State Building Industry Association with Bill Niemi as the founding president; and

WHEREAS, HomeAid Sacramento seeks to make a difference in the lives of those needing
temporary shelter through matching local care providers in need of new or refurbished facilities
with the building industry to provide temporary housing structures for homeless families or
individuals; and

WHEREAS, HomeAid, through generous contributions and in-kind gifts from the building
industry, is able to build housing structures at a fraction of the normal costs using their Builder
Captains program that inspires participation of local homebuilders, subcontractors, suppliers and
consultants to bring materials and manpower to manage each project from beginning to end; and

WHEREAS, Since 1996, HomeAid Sacramento, has completed 11 projects in the Sacramento
region including the Alpha Henson Women's Center, Children's Receiving Home, Youth
Services, Moral Values Program, River Oak Center for Children, Sacramento Children's Home,
Sacramento Valley Teen Challenge and Vietnam Veterans of California; and

WHEREAS, in the coming year, HomeAid expects to complete an additional five projects, which
will provide an additional 150 shelter beds to the Sacramento region; and

WHEREAS, two of the five projects have begun construction including a safe house for PEACE
for Families in Auburn and a cottage for the River Oak Center for Children. In addition, the very
first Senior Safe House in the western United States celebrated its groundbreaking on September
7, 2006; and

WHEREAS, as members of the North State Building Industry Association, HomeAid's greatest
claim to success is the ability to give back to the community in a positive, meaningful and lasting
way.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT PROCLAIMED THAT, the Placer County Board of Supervisors
supports HomeAid Sacramento's 10th Anniversary celebration and thanks HomeAid for building
dignified housing that provides alternative shelter to men, women and children in need of
housing during difficult times in their lives.
