**SUBJECT:** Citizens District 5 Benefit Fund Committee Recommendations – Approve equal appropriations of \$1,111.00 to each of eighteen organizations representing non-profit organizations and events in District 5 Revenue Sharing Funds (Benefit Grant Funds), as recommended by the Citizens District 5 Benefit Committee for a total of \$19,998. The recommended organizations for funding are: Tahoe Truckee Community Scholarship Committee; Boys & Girls Club of North Lake Tahoe; PCSO Search & Rescue; Auburn Host Lions Club; Colfax Grad Night; Child Advocates of Placer County; Placer Sportsmen Inc.; Boys and Girls Club of Auburn; Tahoe Lake Elementary; Very Interested Parents of North Tahoe Middle School; Creekside PTO/Creekside Cooperative; Foresthill Education Foundation; Placer Nature Center; North Tahoe Business Assoc.; Humane Society of Truckee-Tahoe; Squaw Village Neighborhood Co.; Tahoe City Downtown Association; and the West Shore Association.

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**ACTION REQUESTED**

Approve a total appropriation of \$19,998 in District 5 Revenue Sharing Funds (Benefit Grant Funds) to the attached list of non profit organizations and events recommended by the Citizens District 5 Benefit Fund Committee.

**BACKGROUND/COMMUNITY BENEFITS**

Supervisor Kranz directed that a citizens committee be established for the purpose of reviewing and making recommendations on the distribution of revenue sharing funds to various community organizations. The committee has undertaken its first evaluation and has come forward with a list of recommendations to your Board from applications received on behalf of various community groups and interests within District 5. In approving revenue sharing contributions, the Placer County Board of Supervisors finds that each and every approved contribution serves a public purpose by promoting the general welfare of the County and its inhabitants therefore a benefit results to the County.

**DISTRICT 5 BENEFIT COMMITTEE**

Following notices and publicity informing the public of the process and seeking interested citizens, the District 5 Benefit Fund Committee was formed. In addition, to assist the committee in its task of review and evaluation, a list of committee procedures and categories of evaluation was developed. Currently, the District 5 Benefit Committee is comprised of four members; Russell Poulson, Stephanie Perry, Megan Chillemi and Wally Reemlin. Posting of the first meeting of the committee occurred at the Placer County Administrative Offices, 175 Fulweiler Ave., Auburn and on the Supervisor Bruce Kranz Event Calendar on the County Website. A teleconference meeting was held on Tuesday June 19, 2007 at 2:00 pm. A quorum was not present and the meeting was continued to June 20, 2007 at 8:00 am. The meeting was convened again via a teleconference with members constituting a quorum and at that time they voted to recommend the distribution of District 5 Revenue Sharing funds to eighteen different entities in a total amount of \$19,998.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

Funds are available within the District 5 revenue sharing budget.






The Placer County Sheriff's Search & Rescue Organization is a functional unit of the Sheriff's Departments authorized by the California Government Code. Although, our Search & Rescue unit is coordinated by the Sheriff's Department, it is predominately staffed by dedicated volunteers from all walks of life and various professional backgrounds.

Our purpose is to be mission ready at any time of day, any season and in any weather, to search for lost person in any type of terrain. Not only do we cover all of Placer County, but we also provide mutual aid assistance to other counties or states that request our help and expertise. In addition to searches, our members provide other community services and are a valuable asset during disasters. We also assist the Placer County Sheriff's Department with body recovery and evidence searches.

Due to the fact that we are a volunteer organization, our members are not financially compensated for their effort. We find it becomes very expensive for our volunteers to provide their own personal gear and equipment necessary to perform the multitude of tasks required. This year the majority of donations from the public are allocated for the new Communications Truck.

In 2005-06, 362 children were involved in the Placer County Dependency Court and foster care systems (30% were from the Auburn and Greater Foothills areas). At the time, we had only 14 trained CASA volunteers who advocated for only 22 of these children. This year we have been actively working to increase the number of CASA volunteers, and currently we have 31 trained CASAs. Our goal is to increase the number of trained CASA volunteers to 70 by December, 2007, and within two years have enough trained CASA volunteers to meet the need of 75% of the children in the Dependency Court system (the goal established by the California Judicial Council - a branch of the Calif. Administrative Office of the Courts).



Organic seedlings and seeds have been pledged for donation by various local farms and nurseries.

It is the goal of the group of parents leading the Gardening and Nutrition program at Creekside Cooperative to provide experiential instruction to our students and the community through the following activities:

- Partnership with Sierra Watershed Education Partnership (SWEP) to evaluation the BMPs for our site, involving students in the mapping and evaluating process as well as the process of bringing the site to compliance;
- Planning and preparing SWEP and Nutrition Garden Areas, installing irrigation systems and plant protection, selecting native plants for the watershed and nutrition, journaling garden observations and results;
- Meal planning, harvesting, cooking and serving a hot lunch once a week to the students at Creekside;
- The composting phase of the project will begin in August with commencement of fall classes;
- Juwel Cold Frames and Vent Openers will be installed in the fall to protect the gardens from freezing temperatures over the winter; and
- Indoor grow shelves will enable mid-winter seed planting in order to have seedlings in the late spring for planting in the outdoor gardens.

Dear Supervisor Kranz:

Foresthill Education Foundation (FEF), a sub group of Room 5 Learning Centers, Inc., a 501c3 non profit organization created to enhance the education system of Foresthill, is requesting funding for a Pilot Program to bring a promising program designed to improve academic achievement by improving communication between schools and parents. FEF and Foresthill Divide Middle School (FDMS) have joined together to develop and use a software program that will assist teachers, students and parents in understanding requirements of each course and the status of each student, allowing parents to know when their assistance is necessary. The software will accept information including assignments, quizzes, grades and a host of additional interactive teaching tools on line. Moodle is an open source program that is free to all developers. Please see <http://www.moodle.com> for software information. The pilot program will begin with Math, Science, English/Language Arts, and History. We wish to have the teachers trained and the courses up and running before the 2007 fall semester begins.

What we have done so far: (*Valued at \$9,000.00*)

1. Acquired a temporary server for the pilot program.
2. Downloaded the Moodle software and installed it on a server.
3. Added the administration functions, as well as made the programs available to the teachers and administration.
4. Protected the access to prevent unauthorized use and devised the system to be tamperproof.
5. Assigned an information technologist (IT) to the project.
6. Acquired training manual for the IT person to train the teachers and administrators.

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**What we need to proceed:**

1. Funding for one week training for 1 teachers in each grade (4) at FDMS.

This course would train the staff how to enroll their students online and assist teachers in preparing their classes for the pilot program. Training would also show teachers how to place updated courses and classroom assignments online for real-time home access. This software is not a replacement for classroom teaching, but an enhancement. The Technical Committee has placed the program on the server and added the necessary tools to provide a comprehensive learning program.



The Village at Squaw Valley USA has hosted the Alpen Wine Festival for the past 6 years and has never received or requested any funding support from Placer County, the NLTRA or Chamber for the event. This year we will host the 19<sup>th</sup> Annual Alpen Wine Festival on Sunday, September 2<sup>nd</sup> from 2 to 5 pm.

The event is comprised of benefit wine tasting from over 40 Northern California wineries, a huge Silent Auction & raffle and live music with Ivan Najera Quintet. All the proceeds will benefit the Heuga Center for Multiple Sclerosis. Last year we raised \$30,000 in the 3 hours.


As this is one of the Heuga Foundation's most successful events and a main funding source, we have set a goal to raise 25% more this year. The money raised at Alpen Wine is earmarked for our local/regional area to increase not only the number of health and wellness programs but also to broaden the scope and dimension of all the programs they offer for people living with MS. Ex. Jump Start Programs.

Alpen Wine Fest costs the Squaw Village Neighbourhood Company, the event organizers, approximately \$10,000 to put on. Our expenses consist of the need for infrastructure (tables, tents, chairs), the cost of quality live Jazz, security and event staffing, ABC licensing, winery support and glassware for the event. In addition, we also spend approximately \$5000 on promoting the event in local, regional and national markets. We have been able to produce some cost recovery over the past couple of years but are always out of pocket – mainly due to the fact that our annual contribution to the Heuga Center is high, as is cost of glassware.

If we were to receive our funding request of \$1000, we would put this money towards the cost of glassware (which we have purchased from California Glass Co. for 2007 and 2008). Total cost = \$6000

The more help we can get with our actual costs to produce the event, the more the Heuga Center for MS and our local community will ultimately benefit. In addition, we see this event as a revenue generator for Squaw Valley, part of District 5 – the event books hotel rooms and draws shoppers and diners to our local establishments. Any assistance would be graciously received. Thank you for your consideration.
