Dear, Supervisor Weygant

The Lincoln Community Action Group is supported by the Lincoln Lions Club (a 501 C3). We are a group of concerned citizens that has been brought together for the purpose of helping our community, the community of Lincoln, to become drug free. We came together following the January Drug Forum and we have since met on a monthly basis.

Our goal is to raise \$10,000, we are hoping that you will be able to assist us in reaching our goal. This money would be used to help our drug prevention efforts. A bulleted list of activities and events that it would be used for are as follows.

- Paint for community work days to cover graffiti
- Stipends for speakers bureau comprised of adults and youth to speak at community drug awareness forums and school assemblies
- Transportation for students participating in the speakers bureau "Reaching Back" to younger students
- Cost for five (5) banners depicting *Parents Who Host Lose the Most* to be displayed at prominent locations throughout Lincoln and Sheridan as part of the substance-free campaign
- Brochures, leaflets, posters and flyers for outreach regarding the dangers of drug and alcohol abuse
- Refreshments and incentives for parent drug awareness forums to be held at each of the middle/high schools (we would like to have these because it is historically difficult to gain parent support and participation)
- Print costs and postage for a print campaign aimed at raising awareness of the Community Action Group and asking the clergy and targeted neighborhoods in Lincoln for their prevention ideas and involvement
- Print costs for (Parents Who Host Campaign) Parent Pledge card stating the parents will host only alcohol, tobacco and other drug-free parties
- Postage for (Parents Who Host Campaign) so that Parent Pledge cards can easily be mailed to Lincoln PD for entry into their data base enabling parents to easily access and see names of other parents committed to drug-free parties
- Costs for quarterly full page ad in Lincoln News Messenger devoted to *Parents Who Host Lose the Most* and listing the businesses and community members in town who support the campaign
- Funding to support youth development activities for students during major school holidays that provide a positive choice for students

- Testing Kits available for economically challenged parents who desire to drug test their children but are unable to do so because financial difficulties.

We believe that awareness and education are two key elements which are necessary to curb the drug use in Placer County. The above listed activities will go a long way toward filling this need.
