Subject: **PURCHASE CONVEYOR FOR RANGE LEAD RECOVERY SYSTEM
FOR THE AUBURN JUSTICE CENTER**

ACTION REQUESTED/RECOMMENDATION: Authorize the purchase of a conveyor for the lead recovery system in the shooting range at the Auburn Justice Center, located in the Placer County Government Center in North Auburn, and authorize the Purchasing Manager to issue a Purchase Order in the amount of \$51,340 to Savage Range Systems, Inc. (Savage).

BACKGROUND: On September 21, 2004, your Board approved a construction contract with Allen L. Bender, Inc. to construct the Auburn Justice Center (AJC). As part of the scope of the AJC, a shooting range was constructed utilizing a manual lead recovery system. In order to minimize the risk of exposure to a potentially hazardous material, it has been determined that the procurement and installation of an automated conveyor system is necessary. This system will remove the lead and deposit it into a transportable container, eliminating the need for staff to have direct contact with the lead. Funding was added to the AJC project budget, as part of the FY 2006/2007 Final Budget.

The conveyor will be purchased from Savage, the manufacturer of the original Snail Trap Lead System installed at the AJC shooting range. In order provide a functional and safe lead recovery system, removal of some of the existing installation is require to allow installation of the new conveyor and must be designed and built to Savage's original specifications. Facility Services / Building Maintenance will provide the installation of the conveyor, associated electrical work and masonry saw-cutting, as required.

In order to proceed, it is necessary for your Board to approve the purchase of this conveyor and authorize the Purchasing Manager to issue a Purchase Order in the amount of \$51,340 to Savage Range Systems, Inc.

ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE: On January 20, 2004 your Board certified the Final EIR and adopted the Findings of Fact and Statement of Overriding Considerations on the DeWitt Government Center Facility Plan, which fulfills the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act.

FISCAL IMPACT: The total project cost is estimated at \$75,000, including \$51,340 to purchase the system, \$12,000 for installation, \$6,660 in contingency and \$5,000 in project management. There are sufficient funds appropriated in the Capital Projects Fund project account.
