**ACTION REQUESTED:**

The Mental Health, Alcohol and Drug Board respectfully requests the Board of Supervisors approve the reappointment of Don Basham as a Public Interest Member for District 5; and the appointment of Wesley Lamb as a Public Interest Member for District 2, and Kimberly Woodall as a Consumer Member for District 3.

**BACKGROUND:**

Don Basham was appointed to the Board on November 2, 2004. Mr. Basham's first term expired on November 2, 2007 and he has expressed a desire to continue his contribution to this Board's activities by serving a second term. While serving his first term on the Mental Health, Alcohol and Drug Board, Mr. Basham led and was active on the Alcohol and Drug Committee, was instrumental in assisting in launching Placer County's campaign on methamphetamine and other drug awareness, and if reappointed, will serve his second term as Chair. Mr. Basham has an extensive law enforcement background, is retired from the California Highway Patrol, and is an independent consultant in traffic accident reconstruction. His expertise will continue to be of great value.

Wesley Lamb, PhD has applied for a position on the Mental Health, Alcohol and Drug Board as a Public Interest Member. Dr. Lamb brings with him an extensive clinical background and experience in the field of mental health services, specifically related to children and adolescent psychiatry. His long career ranges from teaching, administration, consultation and service delivery. He has served on various professional organizations, including Lincoln Arts and Cultural Foundation, and has volunteered for the American Red Cross and Lincoln High School. Dr. Lamb brings with him a vast educational background and will be an asset to this Board.

Kimberly Woodall has applied for a position on the Mental Health, Alcohol and Drug Board as a Consumer Member. Ms. Woodall has been an active member of various self-help groups and has volunteered for the Salvation Army. She is interested in bringing forth her personal life experiences to help the public and the Board members. Ms. Woodall will bring a needed consumer and family member perspective to this Board.

The Mental Health, Alcohol and Drug Board recommends appointment of the three applicants.
