**BACKGROUND/COMMUNITY BENEFITS:** In approving the following contributions, the Placer County Board of Supervisors finds that each and every approved contribution serves a public purpose by promoting the general welfare of the County and its inhabitants therefore a benefit results to the County.

The Board of Supervisors is being asked to approve appropriations to help support the Roseville Police Activities League (RPAL) Annual Sponsorship Program. The mission of the Roseville Police Activities League is to enrich the lives and develop the physical, mental, and social capabilities of Roseville youth by creating opportunities for positive relationships between youths, police officers and the community by providing a variety of recreational, athletic, social, educational, and cultural activities and programs. Thanks to generous contributions from the community, RPAL had a successful year meeting the RPAL objectives of providing Roseville youth with a safe environment, meaningful activities and positive role models.

The mission of RPAL is to enrich the lives and develop the physical, mental, and social capabilities of Roseville youth by creating opportunities for positive relationships between youths, police officers and the community by providing a variety of recreational, athletic, social, educational, and cultural activities and programs.

RPAL was able to serve Roseville youths due to generous donations received from the community throughout the year totaling more than \$30,000. RPAL also annually applies to the Citizen's Benefit Grant Fund for funding for programs such as the Jr. Giants Program, the After School Tutoring at the North Roseville Recreation Center and various activities scheduled during school breaks throughout the year.

Below you will find a break-down of some of RPAL's programs and the number of youths served this past year. It is important to remember that Roseville police officers participated in most of these programs and trips to build positive relationships with Roseville youths.

#### **Jr. Giants Program**

Jr. Giants is a summer program for youths aged 8 – 13 that promotes self-esteem, teamwork and sportsmanship along with the fundamentals of baseball. This is a non-scoring program. The goal of the program is to reach kids that have little to no baseball experience, but are willing to learn how to play catch, hit a ball and have a memorable and wonderful experience. The program had 109 kids registered and averaged 60 attendees each day. The season ended with a trip to see the San Francisco Giants on Jr. Giants Day at SBC Park.

#### **Open Gym**

The open gym program served 174 kids during ten sessions in the months of July and August. Open gym is held at the RPAL gym twice per week and allows kids the opportunity to play games and interact with the police officers in a fun, open atmosphere.
