SUBJECT: Partnership with Sutter Roseville Medical Center Foundation and the TeenAge Pregnancy and Parenting Program

ACTION REQUESTED:

Approve the attached FY2007-08 cooperative agreement with Sutter Roseville Medical Center Foundation (SRMC), with SRMC to reimburse Placer County for providing parenting classes to pregnant and parenting teenagers in Placer County in the amount of \$22,325, and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services to sign the agreement and subsequent amendments up to 10% of the total contract amount.

BACKGROUND:

The First 5 Placer – Children and Families Commission has awarded a grant to Sutter Roseville Medical Center Foundation to provide additional support and training for pregnant and parenting teens, with the Community Health and Clinics Division providing the parenting classes as an enhancement to its state-mandated TeenAge Pregnancy and Parenting (TAPP) Program. Classes will be offered at three continuation schools located in Auburn, Lincoln, and Roseville, and taught by a Public Health Nurse. The goal of these classes is to help TAPP clients become more knowledgeable, confident, and supported in their use of appropriate parenting skills so that their children are healthy and safe.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Placer County Health and Human Services, Community Health and Clinics Division, will be reimbursed by SRMC up to a total of \$22,325 to provide parenting classes, materials and supplies, and program supervision and evaluation. No County General Funds are needed to implement this program.
