Action Requested

Approve a Resolution commending Tahoe City Public Utility District General Manager Bob Lourey for more than 29 years of service to the North Lake Tahoe community.

Background/Issues

Bob Lourey has been a valued member of the Tahoe City Public Utility District for nearly three decades.

Initially hired as a Maintenance Worker in 1978, Bob was promoted to Senior Maintenance Worker in 1980, then promoted to Operations Superintendent in 1987, promoted to Director of Engineering in 1989 and to Assistant General Manager in 1996. Bob became the Tahoe City Public Utility District's fifth General Manager in 2000, and has served in that capacity since.

During his tenure at the Tahoe City Public Utility District he was involved in over 200 capital projects, varying from well development, sewer and water line replacement to high profile community assets such as bike trails, sidewalks, and beach and park renovation.

In his many years of service to the residents and visitors of North Lake Tahoe, Bob's open management "peacemaker" style has forged meaningful partnerships with local, state and federal agencies and has encouraged staff development and team building.


Fiscal Impact

WHEREAS, Bob Lourey has been a valued employee of the Tahoe City Public Utility District for more than 29 years; and

WHEREAS, Bob began his career with the Tahoe City Public Utility District in 1978 as a Maintenance Worker, was steadily promoted to positions requiring increased responsibility and was hired in 2000 as the District's fifth General Manager; and

WHEREAS, as Director of Engineering and Assistant General Manager and General Manager, Bob was involved in almost 200 highly visible utilities, recreation and other capital projects, including Rubicon I, III, IV, McKimney, Crystal Way, Tahoe City, and Highlands wells, various water and sewer line replacements, Harbor Master pump station, renovation of Commons beach, significant progress toward completion of Lakeside Bike trail segments, Rocky Point and Midway to Squaw Valley bike trails, Tahoe City sidewalks, 64 Acre public access project, North Tahoe High School soccer/softball field and the Lake Forest boat ramp; and

WHEREAS, Bob won numerous awards during his career including the California Water Pollution Control Association Outstanding Service Award and EPA Award for Excellence in Collection System Operator in 1987, the North Lake Tahoe Chamber of Commerce Outstanding Employee of the year in 1994 and the California Water Environment Association Outstanding Service Award in 2001; and

WHEREAS, throughout his tenure with the Tahoe City Public Utility District, Bob encouraged staff development, motivation and team building; and

WHEREAS, Bob also succeeded in strengthening the District's working relationships and partnerships with various local, state and federal agencies, including the North Tahoe Public Utility District, North Tahoe Fire Protection District, California State Parks, the United States Forest Service and Placer County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors, on behalf of the citizens of Placer County, acknowledge with deep appreciation, Bob Lourey's distinguished service to Placer County, and wish him well in his retirement and any new ventures he pursues.
