BACKGROUND

Mal Toy has worked as a civil engineer for over 30 years of which the past 14 have been with the Placer County Water Agency (PCWA). He has been instrumental in the development of water system infrastructures for many large land developments in Placer County and has worked extensively with major state and federal projects. Mal is highly respected by peers and associates throughout the region.

Whereas, Mal Toy is highly respected by his colleges in Placer County and throughout the region; and

Whereas, he has been instrumental in the development of water services throughout Placer County; and

Whereas, Mal is a native of Canada but he was raised in Southern California's San Fernando Valley. Currently, he and his wife, Cindy, live in Granite Bay and they are the parents of one grown son, Andrew; and

Whereas, Mal earned a Bachelors degree in engineering at California State University, Northridge and continued his education to receive his Master's degree in civil engineering from Loyola-Marymount University; and

Whereas, Mal worked as an engineer for aerospace for three years before he began a 20-year career with the Los Angeles Bureau of Sanitation. In 1992, Mal moved to Placer County to work in a management position with the City of Roseville's Environmental Utilities Department; and

Whereas, Mal began working with PCWA as a consultant in 1994 and joined the agency full-time in 1995 as the Deputy Director of Planning and Marketing; and

Whereas, Mal advanced his career at PCWA promoting to Planning Administrator in 2000, Director of Planning in 2003 and Director of Resource Development, his present position, in 2004; and

Whereas, Mal served as the lead representative for many of PCWA's most complicated developments including, in 1996, the formation of the entry into water service for the Zone 4 water service area in the Martis Valley, south of Truckee. In addition, he acted as the local representative for the bi-state and federal Truckee River Operating Agreement (TROA), a complicated pact under negotiation since 1975 that was finally enacted this year; and

Whereas, for the past three years, Mal headed the multi-million-dollar project for PCWA to renew their original 50-year license for the Middle Fork American River Project and under his direction, the PCWA Pre-Application Document was the first in the nation to include a complete package of approved study plans filed under the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's new integrated licensing process. The advance work saved tens of thousands of dollars and months of additional processing time.

Now, Therefore, Let It Be Known That The Placer County Board of Supervisors congratulates Mal Toy on his retirement and thanks him for his contribution towards the development of proper water system infrastructures for PCWA which greatly enhances Placer County and serves to benefit all water users throughout the great state of California.
