SUBJECT: Contract with Muniyapla T. Rajappa, M.D. for Psychiatric Services

ACTION REQUESTED:

Approve a contract with Muniyapla T. Rajappa, M.D. for the provision of after-hours psychiatric services from April 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011 (weekend and after-hours services for one week per month) for a total contract amount not to exceed \$45,000, and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services to sign the contract and subsequent amendments up to 10 percent of the original contract amount. The required County General Fund contribution for this contract is \$13,500. These costs are included in the FY 2009-10 Final Budget, and will also be budgeted in the FY 2010-11 Base Budget for the remainder of the contract term.

BACKGROUND:

The Adult System of Care provides crisis assessment to 2,000 persons per year and subsequent hospitalization to about half of these persons. The persons served in our crisis service are those who are potentially a danger to themselves or others, or gravely disabled due to a mental illness. Psychiatrists are consulted by after-hours staff to make final determinations of dispositions in our work with these persons. This contract authorizes an independent psychiatrist to work one week each month to provide after-hours consultation and admission to inpatient hospitalization for approximately 460 persons. These services are mandated by the State and are critical to the management of the County's mental health system, which provides specialty psychiatric services to persons with acute symptoms.

Dr. Rajappa has provided excellent client care during his first year as a Placer County contractor. His expertise with crisis evaluations has strengthened our after-hours psychiatric services. Dr. Rajappa is a seasoned practitioner who is available to provide critical after-hours, on-call service for 15 weeks per year. He will provide over 1,845 hours of clinical after-hours services to the Adult System of Care.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Funding for this agreement includes \$31,500 in Federal and State revenue, and \$13,500 in required County General Fund match. These costs are included in the FY 2009-10 Final Budget, and will also be budgeted in the FY 2010-11 Base Budget for the remainder of the contract term.
