SUBJECT: Approve the Amended Agreement between the Placer County District Attorney's Office and the California Department of Justice

ACTION REQUESTED

Approve the amended Agreement with the California Department of Justice for forensic alcohol testing, toxicological drug and solid dosage analysis, and reimbursement of a criminalist for the period of July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2014 in the amount of \$332,936, and authorize the District Attorney, upon review and approval by Risk Management and County Counsel, to execute documents required.

BACKGROUND

On August 24, 2010, your Board of Supervisors approved the initial Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the District Attorney's office and the California Department of Justice. The District Attorney has now renegotiated this MOU and two related agreements with the DOJ to provide forensic alcohol testing services, toxicological drug analysis services and analysis of solid dosage drug samples. This agreement also covers the cost of one criminalist to provide these services. This agreement has been utilized by the District Attorney's office for the past three years, since FY 2010-11.

Drug and alcohol testing services are a necessary element utilized by the District Attorney in order to determine if a suspect was under the influence of a controlled substance. The chemical testing done in order to determine a suspect's blood alcohol can be accomplished by either an evidential breath tester (EBT), a chemical test of the suspect's blood, or both. The EBTs must be calibrated and maintained on a regular basis in order to utilize the breath test results in court. Chemical testing of a suspect's blood is done in certain cases to determine whether a DUI suspect was impaired by a substance other than alcohol. The testing regarding drug-induced impairment is referred to as toxicological drug analysis, or toxicology.

This amendment is for an extension through June 30, 2014. This extension will allow DOJ to continue the scope and services specified. The terms and conditions of the existing MOU shall remain in effect until June 30, 2014.

FISCAL IMPACT

These funds were budgeted for FY 2012-13 in the amount of \$144,858, as well as \$188,078 for the FY 2013-14 Proposed Budget, for a total cost of \$332,936. No additional General Fund contributions are necessary.

This agreement is on file with the Clerk of The Board for your review.


This second amendment to the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the analysis of solid dosage drug samples between the State of California, through the California Department of Justice (DOJ), Bureau of Forensic Services, and the County of Placer shall entered into on the first day of July 2013.

This second amendment is for a time extension through June 30, 2014, from the first amendment of July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013. The first amendment continued the original annual cost of a Criminalist Range C as \$109,152.00 ($\$109,152/12=\$9,096$ per month). This dollar amount is sufficient to cover the reimbursement of the second amendment as well. This extension will allow DOJ to continue the scope and services previously specified. The terms and


conditions of the original MOU, other than the new dates, shall remain in effect until June 30, 2014.

In witness whereof, the parties hereto have executed this MOU AMENDMENT on the day and year first hereinabove written.


