**BACKGROUND/COMMUNITY BENEFITS:** In approving the following contributions, the Placer County Board of Supervisors finds that each and every approved contribution serves a public purpose by promoting the general welfare of the County and its inhabitants therefore a benefit results to the County.

The Board of Supervisors is being asked to approve appropriations to help fund The Gathering Inn for their Emergency Overnight Shelter expenses. Since The Gathering Inn's incorporation in September 2004, more than forty churches have united to provide the only emergency housing program in Placer County. The faith-based program strives to foster a spirit of hope and dignity in the people it serves and works to transition people out of homelessness, by linking to appropriate existing services or by developing new ones. The Gathering Inn is the only emergency overnight shelter in South Placer County and provides warm meals, a safe place to sleep, and social services to address the reasons for homelessness.

The funds designated will help provide physical, mental and spiritual restoration for homeless women, men and children and help offset the costs for case management services including transportation services and medical appointments.

Please find enclosed a request for Revenue Sharing funds. These monies will be used to provide transportation to homeless persons to shelter, medical appointments and other case management services. These funds help The Gathering Inn have a huge impact on the homeless population.

**. OUR IMPACT:**

Case management services placed 220 persons into permanent housing in the past two years .  
135 persons received mental health services – reducing “5150” police calls, self medicating with street drugs and/or alcohol

315 received medical care at the community medical clinic located on our campus – many are residents of this community who can not afford to see a doctor

132 avoided going to the local emergency room because of the clinic’s services. 89 persons who have had a recent medical procedure were discharged from hospitals to the Interim Care Program to receive respite care – reducing the number of 911 calls

- Each year approximately 20-25 persons attend Access to Recovery a 13-week free outpatient treatment program for those person suffering from addiction. Their sobriety efforts are supported with two 12 step meetings held on campus
- More than 1,900 trips were provided to Auburn for mainstream benefits, ongoing medical concerns, psychiatric medication renewal, TB testing, assessment for residential substance abuse and information on the two housing options the county offers
- More than 20,264 warm meals and beds were provided at area churches
- TGI’s clothing closet services an average of 72 persons per week, providing coats, shoes and other warm clothes. This is open to anyone in the community who need help making ends meet.
- The Gathering Inn is working with the Roseville Police Dept. and Placer Superior Courts to supervise “Community Service” hours for “homeless” infractions – alleviating the courts and jail of adjudication costs
