Subject: Transfer of Unclaimed Monies to the General Fund

Action Requested: Adopt the attached resolution directing the Auditor-Controller to transfer unclaimed overpayments in the amount of \$6,836.67 and unclaimed victim restitution in the amount of \$3,618.54 per Government Code Section 50053 and Placer County's Policy Directive on Unclaimed Funds. Unclaimed funds related to victim restitution are deposited into a fund for the purposes of victim services. All other unclaimed funds are transferred into the General Fund.

Background: Government code section 50050 et seq. addresses monies that have remained unclaimed in the County Treasury for a period of excess of three years.

Per the Placer County Auditor-Controller's Office Policy Directive on Unclaimed Funds, County Departments were issued instructions and a Schedule of Unclaimed Funds form to complete and return to the Auditor Controller. A completed copy was also submitted to the Treasurer-Tax Collector who then published once a week for two successive weeks (July 18, 2014 and July 25, 2014) in the The Auburn Journal newspaper per code requirement notices of unclaimed funds. The Treasurer-Tax Collector also listed the unclaimed property in more detail on the Placer County Treasurer-Tax Collector's web page including the instructions and the claim form for anyone seeking to recover all or part of this money.

No inquiries or claims were filed on the unclaimed monies and they will become the property of the county as provided under Government Code Section 50051.

Fiscal Impact: Additional revenue of \$10,455.21 in the General Fund for FY 2014/15.

WHEREAS, after such time the Auditor-Controller has concluded that this money is now available for escheatment,

WHEREAS, notices were given to all known and apparent legal and beneficial owners of unclaimed money to be escheated whose whereabouts are known, and

WHEREAS, the Treasurer-Tax Collector published once a week for two successive weeks in the local newspaper per Government Code Section 50050 requirements, and listed the unclaimed property in more detail on the Placer County Treasurer-Tax Collector's web page including the instructions and the claim form for anyone seeking to recover all or part of this money;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that The Board of Supervisors of the County of Placer hereby direct the Auditor-Controller to transfer the unclaimed monies to the General Fund per Government Code Section 50053 and per Placer County Auditor-Controller's Policy Directive on Unclaimed Funds.
