Action Requested

Approve and present a Commendation honoring Allison Carlos, Principal Management Analyst for 25 years of service to Placer County.

Background/Community Benefits

Allison Carlos began work with Placer County in 1990 when she was hired by the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). Her career with the County has spanned 25 years culminating with her work in the County Executive Office (CEO).

Allison was originally hired as an Environmental Health Specialist II for the Environmental Health division of HHS in 1990. She promoted to Environmental Health Specialist III in 1992 and was promoted to a Supervisor of Environmental Health in 1998.

In February of 2003, Allison brought her knowledge and technical expertise to the County Executive Office when she was hired as a Principal Management Analyst focusing on Land Development issues and Legislation. She has continued in that position for the CEO while also assuming additional roles and responsibilities. In 2013 she began representing the interests of the former Redevelopment Agency Oversight Board, including disposition of redevelopment projects and administration of the Successor Agency in addition to her existing workload.

Allison has been a dedicated and committed employee working diligently to represent the best interests of Placer County. She should be commended for her many years serving the public.
