**1. Called to Order & Pledge of Allegiance – 7:00 PM**

**4. Reports:**

**A. Public Safety:**

CAL FIRE – Jim Mathias – (916) 408-2718 – **1)** There was a serious boating accident at Camp Far West – six people were thrown from the boat, there was one casualty. **2)** The water situation in our area is doing ok for now. However, south of Highway 50 to the East, West and South to Southern California, the water situation is not that great. **3)** With the temperatures heating up, it is strongly urged to be extra cautious when swimming in the rivers. The snow is melting and the runoff causes the rivers to be colder and move more swiftly. **4)** Currently control burns are allowed but probably not for much longer. **5)** Take precautions when mowing your property and yards. It is best to do early in the morning before it heats up. **6)** Make sure that your property is clearly marked and that if you own a gate that it is easy accessible for the Sheriff and Fire Department. **7)** Clear gutters, roofs and under decks of debris, remove any wood piles away from the house. **8)** There are multiple little fires burning throughout the state. 2 of the larger fires are burning in Los Angeles County. **9)** Placer County Fire performed a multi agency control burn at Athens and Catlett Roads. The departments that participated were from Roseville, Rocklin and Lincoln. **CHP** – Antone Steinhauer – During the period of May 1, 2016 through June 20, 2016 there were 6 motor vehicle accidents. 3 were DUI caused and 3 were caused by unsafe speed. **Placer County Sheriff's Office** Deputy Bryant -- (530) 889-7800 – **No Report**

Local Government: Placer County** - Lyndell Grey, Associate Aide to Placer County Supervisor Robert Weygandt ([lgrey@placer.ca.gov](mailto:lgrey@placer.ca.gov) or 530-889-4010); **1)** After the recent elections, Supervisors Montgomery, Uhler and Homes have a big lead in their respective districts. **2)** The Board of Supervisors are working on the next fiscal year budget. Currently it is less than last years at \$742,000,000. **3)** The County will be closing the Meadow Vista and Loomis libraries. **4)** The County is resurfacing roads throughout Western Placer County. **5)** *The County is working on the Marijuana ordinance. There is a meeting on June 21, 2016 at 1:00 and the Board will be seeking input from the public.* **6)** *Sierra Foothill Meat Processing Plant is still moving forward and they are looking at 2 potential locations in Sheridan and also at the Lincoln High School Farm.* **7)** *There is a citrus killing insect affecting citrus trees in California.* **8)** *Placer Ranch development is moving along. The Board of Supervisors is moving forward to awarding contracts for the Sunset Industrial Park area.* **9)** *The Placer County Fair is June 23<sup>rd</sup> – June 26<sup>th</sup>.*  
**City of Lincoln** – Councilmember Gabriel Hydrick ([ghydrick@lincolnca.gov](mailto:ghydrick@lincolnca.gov) or 916-434-2490) – **1)** Every Monday night is family swim at McBean Park. **2)** The City library is in the process of updating its electronic system. **3)** The annual Air Fest was a success. **4)** PG&E is installing new gas line on East 5<sup>th</sup> Street. **5)** New waterline on C Street is moving forward. **6)** McBean Stadium renovations have begun. The project has a possible end of August completion timeframe. **7)** Chief Jimenez park improvements include tennis and basketball court, new fencing with completion near the end of this year. **8)** In and Out is coming. They are in the process of completing all contracts. They are hoping to open in November of this year. **9)** The Regional Sewer Project is up and running. **10)** Foskett Ranch Park looking to switch over to reclaimed water.

**5. Information Item:**

**A. Issues Concerning Fiddymment Road and Sunset West Intersection:**

The County is still collecting data on the need for a 3 way stop at the intersection of Fiddymment and Sunset West Blvd. Current shows that there have been a number of rear-end accidents northbound Fiddymment and eastbound Sunset West. Placer County Public Works Department is waiting for additional data from

the CHP for the purposes of the need the 3 way stop. They are willing to come back to Rural Lincoln for an update and what they have determined can or cannot work. A few ideas in addition to the 3 way stop is to have a laminated intersection and possible use of a flashing signal. The Department is applying for a grant for long range plans and ideas.

**B. Placer County Adult Supervision Services:**

Chief Probation Officer David McManus and Probation Manager Brian Passenheim provided an overview of the probation Population and information about the Placer Re-Entry Program (PREP). This is a program available to men and women residing in Placer County. The objective of the PREP Center is to provide clients with one on one and group level series to assist with their transition back into the community.

This program provides both in custody and out of custody programs tailored to the specific needs of the individual. The PREP Center Courses are Life Skills – include thinking of change; courage to change; alcohol and drug education; anger management, parenting classes and money management; Education include GED preparation and testing, basic literacy and computer literacy and Employment – Placer Works Employment Education; Resume Assistance; job search assistance; interview skills, referrals for employment service. Other services include: Assistance with Identification; assistance with obtaining medical care; transportation assistance and benefit screenings and workshops.

Probation Population is as follows:

Formal Probation: 3,484 (average of 50 new grants each month) – 93% of supervised population

Post release community supervision: 172 (average of 11 new per month) – 5% supervised population

Mandatory Supervision: 77 (average 4 new per month – 2% of population.

Intake Process: Discuss terms of probation, restitution repayment and reporting instructions; gather identifying information; conduct a risk/needs assessment to determine supervision level and appropriate services; create case plan to track compliance and re-entry goals.

Average probation contacts per month:

Office contacts: 2,155 (107 per day);  
Home contacts: 958 (48 per day)  
Searches: 390 (20 per day)

Supervision Practices – supervision contact standards based on risk levels; focus on best practices and offering evidence-based programs; focus on re-entry, specialized caseloads and Warrant/DUI sweeps.

#### Lincoln/Sheridan Probation Population

The City of Lincoln Police works closely with the Probation Department. They have a Deputy Probation Officer on site. He works collaboratively with the Police Department and conducts his appointments at there.
