7. Information tem:

Eldon Luce from the Older Adult Advisory Commission Chairman provided an overview of what services are provided for older adults in the County.

They advise the Board of Supervisors on matters relating to older adults in Placer County; advise Department of Health and Human Services on matters relating to the creation and delivery of services for the County’s older adults and they advise local and regional agencies on services and delivery for older adults in the County.

The commission evaluates the services provided to older adults and make recommendations regarding unmet needs; review applications and make recommendations for funding services through Area 4 Agency on Aging, advocate for increased services for older adults in Placer County and review legislation impacting older adults and provide reports to the Placer County Board of Supervisors.

From 2013 to 201 the population of 60 to 64 year olds will grow 24%. During that same time the growth of older adults between the ages of 70 to 74 will grow 44%. Ages 75 and 90 years of age will see a growth increase of 41% and ages 90 to 95 years there will be a 56% growth increase. The growth in the older adult population is being accompanied by a proportional growth in the number of persons with disabilities.

The near tripling of the older adult population will translate into a near tripling of the number of older persons with functional limitations between 2000 and 2040.
