UPDATE ON MARIJUANA GROWING IN PLACER COUNTY

On June 21st the Board of Supervisors voted to develop a new ordinance on medical marijuana that would limit cultivation to small indoor grows by patients. The board voted to take this slow and restrictive approach, rather than attempting to set up a license and permit approach. This new approach will alleviate much of the nuisance of marijuana growth in the Sheridan community that has been problematic for families and children.

A majority of Placer County Supervisors voted for the more conservative approach limiting medical marijuana cultivation to just small indoor grows by patients. This still keeps all options open for the future.

- AT the June 21st board meeting, the supervisors gave specific directions to the county staff to return at a future date with a draft ordinance for limited cultivation of small indoor grows by patients. When this proposed ordinance is written it will be publicly noticed, and a public hearing will be held before the Board of Supervisors. The community will have ample opportunity to have input.
- It will take several weeks for the staff to develop this new ordinance and for it to go through the hearing process. Whatever the version that results, it is most likely that the new ordinance will not be completed until after November 2016.
- In addition it is probable that there will be significant changes in federal and state law in regard to this issue in the next few months. Such changes will ultimately influence future decisions on this subject by the Board for Placer County.
