5. **PUBLIC SAFETY/COMMUNITY ORGANIZATION REPORTS:**

- a. **CAL Fire** – Nick Sayles – Atwood Station has received 300+ calls. 3600 calls are projected for 2016, which is an increase over last year (3387 in 2015). Multiple control burns are being activated. He reminded all of the defensible space requirements.

Several Highway 49 fatality accidents were responded to. Control burn restrictions are in place until June 15.

- c. Placer County Sheriff's Office – Deputy Joe Jacinto – Large percentage of transient population incident calls have been recorded this last month. An increase in calls is anticipated in the coming months. If assistance is needed, please call PSCO.**

6. PUBLIC COMMENT / ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Peter Efstathiou, Placer High Principal provided information on the Placer Union High School District Measure C which will be on the June 7 Presidential Primary election ballot. He said that if approved, Measure C will make \$135 million available through the sale of general obligation bonds. Funds will be used to expand the science technology, engineering, arts and math classrooms and to fund major renovations, repairs and upgrades to aging classrooms and schools throughout the District. He was available for questions and comments.

8. INFORMATION/NON-ACTION ITEM:

A. Potential County Clinics Transition

Maureen Bauman, Placer County Health and Human Services, provided an update on the current Request for Proposal (RFP) process to identify a potential clinical service provider to expand primary care clinic services in Auburn and Kings Beach and to facilitate a transition of county clinic operations and patients to the new service provider. Currently, 4 responses to the RFP have been received and are being evaluated.

- B. Placer County Adult Supervision Services:** The Placer County Probation Department currently supervises approximately 3700 adult offenders granted formal probation, Post Release Community Supervision and those placed on Mandatory Supervision pursuant to Parole Realignment (AB 109). The

department utilizes a balanced approach by enforcing laws, conditions of release and directing offenders to appropriate risk based rehabilitative services.

Marshall Hopper, Placer County Chief Probation Officer, provided a presentation to give MAC members and the public an update on our offender supervision practices and our approach to supervising homeless offenders in the community.

He provided information including: supervision practices, average probation contacts per month, homeless probation population, primary offense groups, and current supervisor strategy. Mr. Hopper answered questions and comments from the MAC and public.

California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, Division of Adult Parole Operations

David Nichols, Parole Administration, Northern Region, Division of Adult Parole Operations and staff presented an overview of operations out of the Northern Region office located in North Auburn, including how inmates are paroled and how they transfer after their parole.

Mr. Nichols answered questions and comments from the MAC and public.
