Notary Consumer Disclosure Requirement (SB 1050)

Effective January 1, 2015, pursuant to Senate Bill 1050, the Placer County Registrar of Voters-Clerk-Recorder's Office will require the Notary Consumer Disclosure. This bill requires a legible notice at the top of the certificate of acknowledgment in an enclosed box, stating that the acknowledgment, proof of execution or jurat verifies only the identity of the individual who signed the document to which the acknowledgment, proof of execution or jurat is attached, and not the truthfulness, accuracy, or validity of the document.

Documents wherein the person appeared before a notary public, or other officer, or after January 1, 2015 must have this disclosure or the document will not be accepted for recordation. Documents acknowledged before January 1, 2015 will be accepted for recordation and must meet current applicable statutes.

A notary public or other officer completing this certificate verifies only the identity of the individual who signed the document to which this certificate is attached, and not the truthfulness, accuracy, or validity of that document.

This requirement has been made in accordance with the legislative amendment to Sections 1189 and 1195 of the Civil Code, and to amend Section 8202 of the Government Code, relating to notaries public.
